What a joy it is to watch the attendees walk down the red carpet, as their names are announced and they are cheered on by family and friends. Each prom-goer is given a crown for the evening, because everyone at the event is a King or a Queen. And there are lots of fun things to do. There is face painting, a photo booth, and delicious snacks and treats. But the highlight of the night is the dancing! There is a DJ who plays the music and all of the special guests get out on the floor and have a good time!

When I think about "A Night To Remember," I picture God above it all, smiling down on those who are involved. He sees people of all ages dancing and laughing and enjoying each other's company. He sees people from our church and from all over the community, organizing and working and serving, so that the night will be special for everyone. There is no anger, there is no violence, there is no division. There is only joy. It makes me think of the words of the Psalmist. He says to the people of God, "Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing!"

This is how I picture heaven. I think it will be a place where God's people sing and dance and praise their Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. In that place, all challenges will be overcome. All fears will be gone. All tears will be wiped away. It will be "A Night To Remember" for all people, for all eternity. And our special needs friends are giving us a glimpse of the joy right now. In their smiles we see the love of God. And we can't help but smile back.
