

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord!'" (Psalm 122:1, ESV)

Like David writes in the verse above, I am anxiously waiting for the day when we can all come back into the church building and worship our Lord as we have in the past. I am just as tired of this COVID-19 as all of you are. I wish I had the power to end this virus right now. And every night I pray to the one who has that power and I ask him to remove this plague from us. But so far I have only gotten the answer that Paul got when he asked God to heal him of his physical ailment. God said, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:9) In other words, when we are knocked down by something as small as a microscopic virus, we are reminded of how weak we really are. And we are reminded of how dependent upon God we really are. And if we see this crisis through the eyes of faith, then we will draw closer to God because he is our only certain hope for salvation.

But in the meantime, what do we do about worship? Right now, the Church Council has decided that our best course of action is to provide three different worship opportunities which limit our physical contact with other worshippers. One of those worship opportunities is our outdoor worship service at 9:30 a.m. on Sunday mornings. I lead worship while standing on a hayrack at the southeast corner of the main parking lot. Some people pull up in their cars and tune their radios to 89.7 FM, a frequency that is not in use in our area. We broadcast our service using a small FM transmitter which shoots the signal for about a quarter of a mile. It's really pretty cool! Other people sit on lawn chairs or blankets in the grass next to the parking lot. We have a couple of radios set up to broadcast the service in that area. We usually have about 60 people in attendance at this service.

One of the great things about the outdoor worship service is that several people who would not be able to worship indoors have been able to worship every week in the parking lot. It has been such a joy to see Merle Polson at worship every Sunday morning! Merle is battling cancer, and it's getting more serious, but it can't keep him away from worship. And he is able to visit with many of his friends and family members before and after church, even if they have to talk through the glass of his car window. Several others are in the same situation as Merle. Once we go back inside, they will not be able to worship with us in person. So I am glad that we have been blessed with their presence this summer.

The second worship opportunity is on Saturday morning. At 9:30 a.m., I do a full worship service in the sanctuary, with Glenn Allen recording it on the camera and Tracy Brenneman or Rick Cook running the sound board. Music is played by either Lynne Swanson or Kathy Allen, and my wife Lisa helps me get ready for the children's sermon. We decided that if we could keep the attendance under the state limit of 50, we would continue to do that. So far, attendance has been in the range of 15-20, so we still have lots of room left if you want to join us on Saturday.

And the third worship opportunity is online. As I mentioned above, we tape the Saturday morning service. Glenn then uploads the video to Youtube and Mary Ann Smith links it to our church website at flcprinceton.org so that people can watch at home. The video is usually uploaded by Saturday evening and is available for you to watch at your convenience. Between the full service video and the "sermon only" video, we have about 100-120 views every week. That probably works out to about 200 people watching online every week!

So that is what we are doing for worship right now. But what are we going to do when the weather changes and the warm Sunday mornings become cold and blustery? Well, we are planning to bring our Sunday morning worship back into the sanctuary. And I can hardly wait for that day! At the September Church Council meeting, we will be making a decision about exactly when we will come inside. We plan to be outside through the whole month of September and at least part of October. So we'll keep you up to date about when that transition will happen. When we do start worshipping inside, we will observe safety protocols, such as masks and hand sanitizer and social distancing.

As we plan for our return to indoor worship, we would like to get your input on how that should happen. So we would like to take a little survey. The survey will help us to plan for the number of worshipers that we will have on Sunday morning. We are going to try to keep all services under 50 people, so that we can follow the social distancing guidelines. We will continue to tape our service on Saturday morning at 9:30 a.m. and post it online that evening. So those options will not change. But if we have more than 50 on Sunday, then we might have to get creative.

Maybe we will do two Sunday morning services, to keep the numbers down at any one service. That is one of the things that we'll be talking about at the Council meeting. And we need your input to make those decisions. You can help us out by answering one simple question.

When we go back to indoor worship on Sunday mornings, when are you most likely to attend?

- 1. I will attend on Sunday morning.**
- 2. I will attend on Saturday morning.**
- 3. I will watch the service on the internet.**

Please call the church office (815-875-1685) during the week and let June know what your worship preference is. She will record the number of people in your family and whether you will worship on Sunday, Saturday, or online. If no one is there to answer your call, please leave your name and your worship preference on June's answering machine.

Your responses will help us to make our decisions about indoor worship this fall. And your love and support and understanding will help us to get through the next few months until we come to the day when we can worship indoors without masks and hand sanitizer. I love you guys and I look forward to seeing your healthy, smiling, maskless faces every Sunday in the not-too-distant future! Amen and Amen!

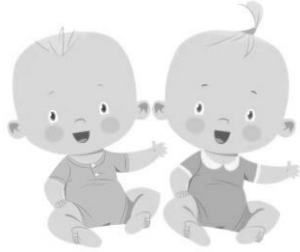

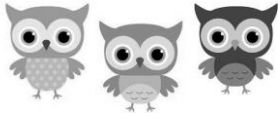


ANNUAL GATHERING
